Make sure that when applying to any of the various scholarships you pay attention to the deadlines. Information regarding these scholarships, as well as their applications, can be found in the Career Center. If you have questions please ask either your guidance counselor or Mrs. Gaggiano. However, keep in mind that it is **your responsibility** to check into these scholarships. It is **not** Mrs. Gaggiano's responsibility to do scholarship research for you.

Other Notes:

At this time, or in the near future, you should be receiving your financial aid packages from schools. As these come in, be sure to respond to all correspondence by the stated deadlines. Also, make sure to go over each financial aid package very carefully in order to identify the amount of loans that are within the package. If you have any questions regarding the financial information you received or if you are not happy with it, call the school's financial aid office. There is nothing wrong with calling the schools and asking for additional help, especially if it is your first choice. It is never a guarantee that a school will change your financial aid package, but it can't hurt. We have had students who have been successful with getting additional money.

Once you do choose your school and send in a deposit, you should notify all other schools you have been accepted to that you will not be attending.
