Lackawanna Trail School District Special School Board Meeting Minutes May 22, 2023

The Lackawanna Trail School District met in person and via Zoom for a scheduled meeting on Monday, May 22, 2023 at 7:05 pm, public notice thereof having been given in accordance with applicable law.

President Joe Ross called the meeting to order and directed the secretary to call the roll. Board Members present: Adrian Bianchi, Mark Carpenter, Heather Clark, Brendan Dwyer, Jaclyn Litwin, Robert Minick, Dr. Michael Mould, Joseph Ross and Tracy Wescott.

Administrators present: Mr. Glynn, Dr. Murphy and Mr. Rakauskas. Mr. Kearney, Mrs. Kuchak, Mr. Schofield and Ms. Talarico were absent. Solicitor David Conn was absent.

There was an opportunity for public participation provided. The following persons shared public comment:

Susanne Green: Enrollment decline, concern about financial reporting for fund balance.

Joseph Strauch: 50 years as taxpayer, taxes go up every year.

Gail Cobb: 34 years in district, tax going up every year. May move out of district.

Candace Haft: Objects to lawn mower, questioned whether we got any higher offers for naming

rights of the wellness center, suggested using modular building.

Michael Bass: Suggested waiting for bids and then looking at modular building.

Missey Bower: Wellness Center

Christy Clark: Naming rights with PS Bank, did we look at other sponsors.

Approval of Minutes

Mrs. Wescott made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dwyer, that the minutes from the May 8, 2023 School Board Meeting be approved as submitted. The motion passed by a unanimous vote of 8-0. Mr. Bianchi had not yet arrived to vote on this motion.

Elementary Cooler and Freezer Upgrades

Mr. Carpenter made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Litwin, to approve the Business Office to solicit bids for upgrades to the Elementary Freezer and Coolers. The motion passed by a unanimous vote of 9-0.

High School Cooler and Freezer Upgrades

Mrs. Wescott made a motion, seconded Mr. Carpenter, that the board approve the Business Office to solicit bids for replacement and upgrades to the High School Freezer and Coolers. The motion passed by a unanimous vote of 9-0.

Health Insurance MOA

Mr. Carpenter made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Clark, that the board approve the health insurance memorandum of agreement between Lackawanna Trail School District and the Lackawanna Trail Education Association. The motion passed by a unanimous vote of 9-0.

Advertising Rates 2023-2024

Mrs. We scott made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dwyer, that the board approve the following advertising rates in the high school and elementary gyms for 2023-2024, on the recommendation of the superintendent:

- a. 3' x 4' \$250
- b. 4' x 6' \$300
- c. Annual renewal \$75

The motion passed by a unanimous vote of 9-0.

Title III MOU

Mrs. Clark made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Litwin, that the board approve the Title III MOU with the NEIU-19 Consortium for the 2023-2024 school year. The motion passed by a unanimous vote of 9-0.

Table Naming Rights Sponsorship

Mrs. Wescott made a motion, seconded by Mr. Carpenter, that the board table the motion to approve the naming rights proposal from PS Bank for the Wellness Center contingent upon approval and build of the project. The motion failed by a roll call vote of 4 yes, 5 no. Mr. Bianchi, Mr. Dwyer, Mr. Minick, Dr. Mould and Mr. Ross voted no.

Naming Rights Sponsorship

Mr. Dwyer made a motion, seconded by Dr. Mould, that the board approve the naming rights proposal from PS Bank for the Wellness Center contingent upon approval and build of the project. The motion passed by a roll call vote of 5 yes, 4 abstaining. Mr. Carpenter, Mrs. Clark, Mrs. Litwin and Mrs. Wescott abstained from voting. Abstention forms were filed.

Policy for Adoption

Dr. Mould made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Wescott, that the board approve the adoption of the following policy: 827 Conflict of Interest. The motion passed by a unanimous vote of 9-0.

Policy for Second Reading

Dr. Mould made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Clark, that the board approve the second reading of the following policy: 828 Fraud. The motion passed by a unanimous vote of 9-0.

Mr. Ross announced that there would be an executive session prior to the next meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 8:24 pm.
